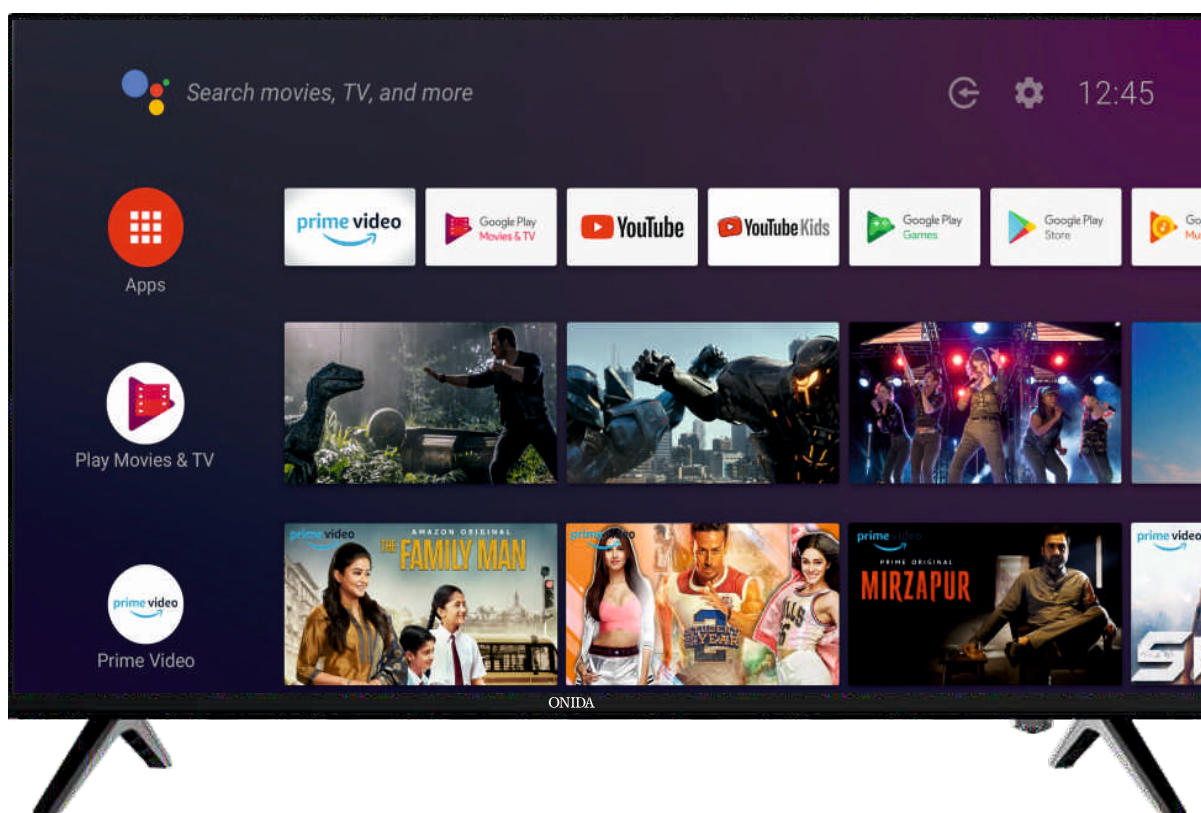

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SAFETY :**PROPER TELEVISION PLACEMENT MATTERS**

- We are committed to making home entertainment safe and enjoyable.
- As you enjoy your television, please note that all televisions - new and old - must be supported on proper stands or installed

according to the manufacturer's recommendations. Televisions that are inappropriately placed on dressers, bookcases, shelves, desks, speakers, chests, carts, etc., may fall over, resulting in injury.

TUNE IN TO SAFETY

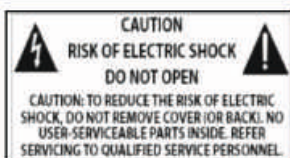
- ALWAYS follow the manufacturer's recommendations for the safe installation of your television.
- ALWAYS read and follow all instructions for proper use of your television.
- NEVER allow children to climb on or play on the television or the furniture on which the television is placed.
- NEVER place the television on furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a chest of drawers.
- ALWAYS install the television where it cannot be pushed, pulled over or knocked down.
- ALWAYS route cords and cables connected to the television so that they cannot be tripped over, pulled or grabbed

WALL OR CEILING MOUNT YOUR TELEVISION

- ALWAYS contact your retailer about professional installation if you have any doubts about your ability to safely mount your television.
- ALWAYS use a mount that has been recommended by the television manufacturer and has a safety certification by an independent laboratory (such as VESA).
- ALWAYS follow all instructions supplied by the television and mount manufacturers.
- ALWAYS make sure that the wall or ceiling where you are mounting the television is appropriate. Some mounts are not designed to be mounted to walls and ceilings with steel studs or cinder block construction. If you are unsure, contact a professional installer.
- Televisions can be heavy. A minimum of two people are required for a wall or ceiling mount installation

MOVING AN OLDER TELEVISION TO A NEW PLACE IN YOUR HOME

- After purchase of flat panel television, many new television buyers move their older televisions into a secondary room. Special care should be made in the placement of older televisions.
- ALWAYS place your older television on furniture that is sturdy and appropriate for its size and weight.
- NEVER place your older television on a dresser where children may be tempted to use the drawers to climb.

Warning

Electric shock hazard

Power lines

Handling the LCD panel

Power source

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to your TV, make sure that the antenna or cable system is grounded to provide same protection against voltage surges and built up static charges Condensation Moisture Will form on the TV if the TV is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the Temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the TV's performance may be impaired, To prevent this, let the TV stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually. Condensation may also form during the summer if the TV is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the TV.

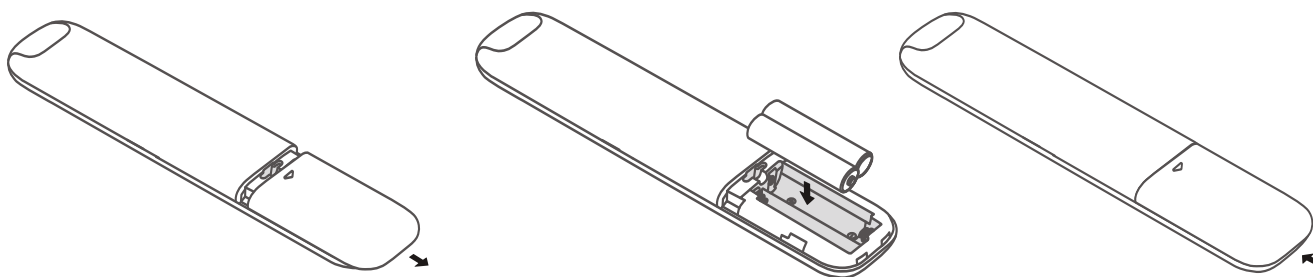

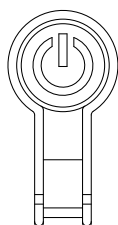

Step 2: Press  button to enter the "RC pairing"

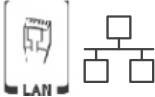
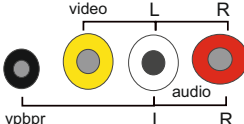
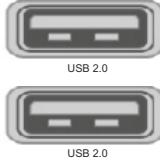
Step 3: Follow the "Settings tips page", Press **OK** and + **volume** together.

INSTALLATION

Attaching the stand

Step 1

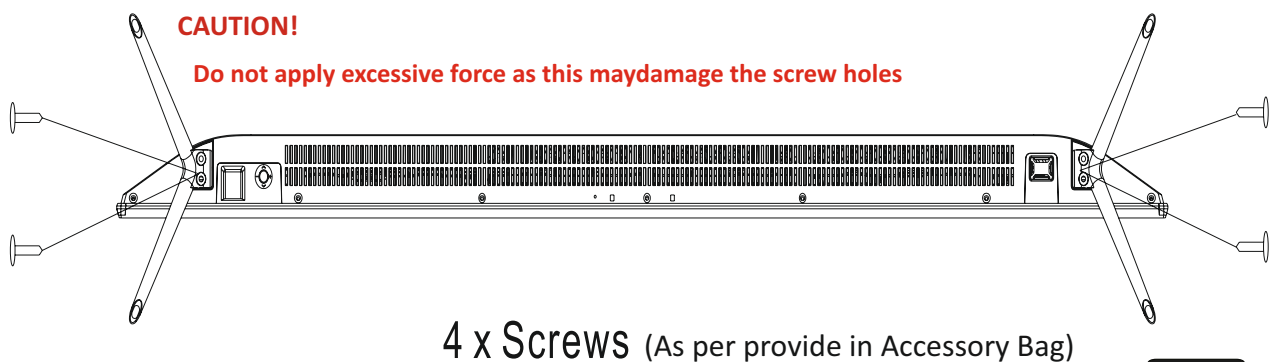

Align the stand leg to the installation point, as illustrated below

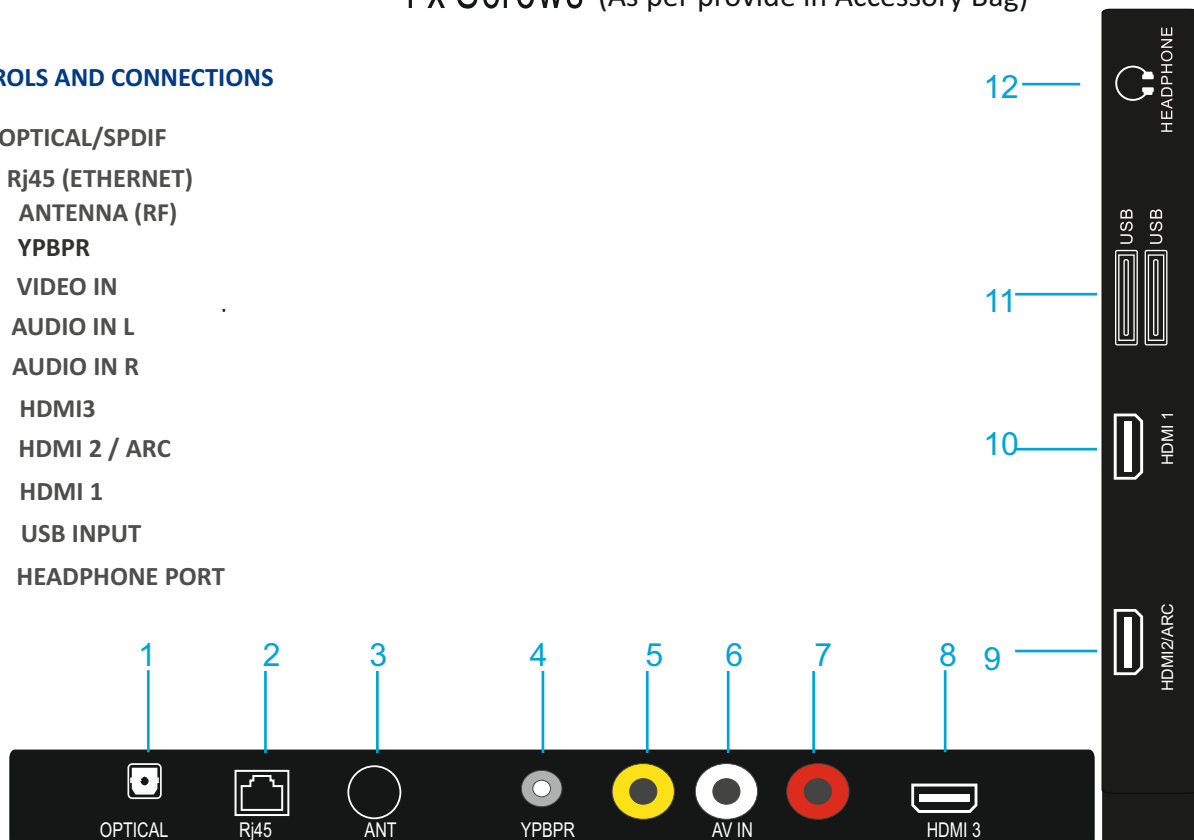

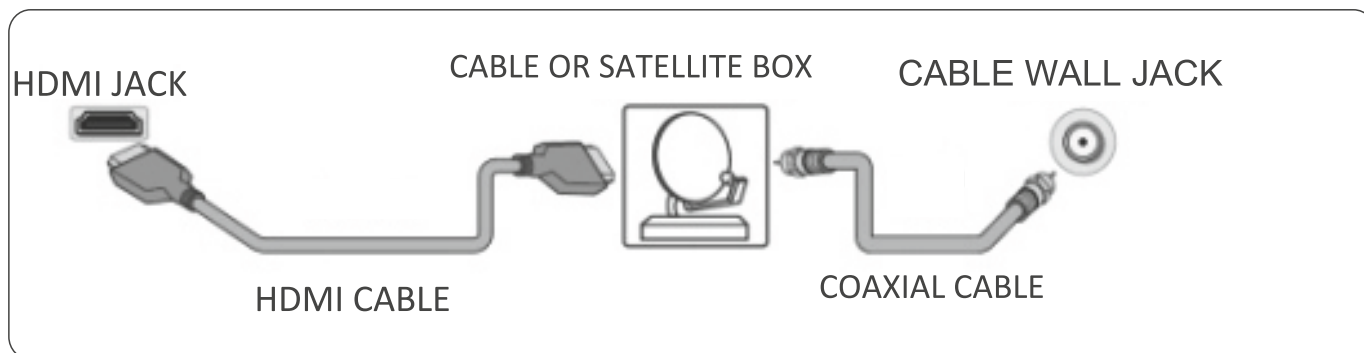
Tighten the screws (supplied) with a screwdriver to affix the stand to the panel, as illustrated on the right.

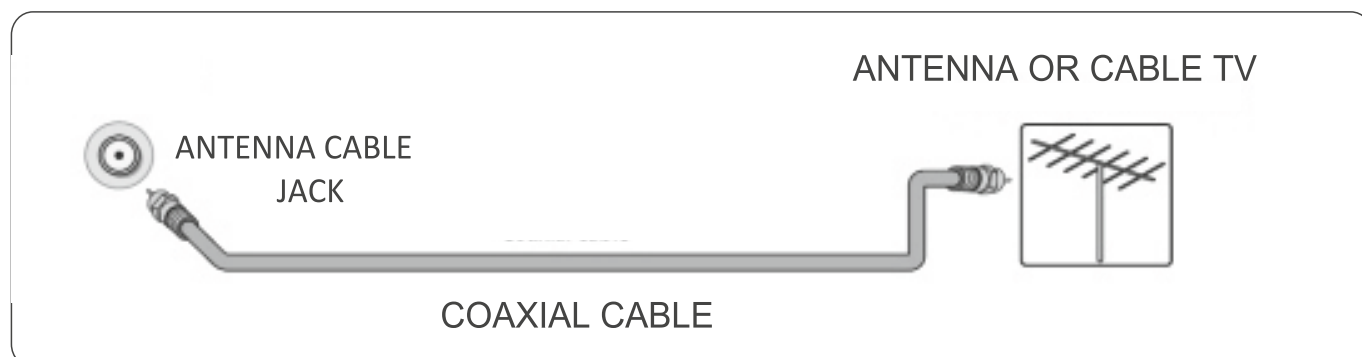


Connecting a Cable or set Top box or DTH.

Many cable or STB TV boxes have more than one connection type. To get the best video, you should use the best connection type available. You can connect a cable or STB /DTH using (in order of preference)

- 1.) Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and all connected equipment is turned Off.
- 2.) Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the cable wall jack and to the cable -in jack on the cable or STB.
- 3.) Connect an HDMI cable (not provided) to one of the HDMI jacks on your TV and to the HDMI out jack on the cable or STB/DTH box
- 4.) On the HOME screen, navigate to the INPUTS row, then select HDMI 1 ,HDMI 2 or HDMI 3

Note: An HDMI cable carries both audio and video. You do not need to use separate audio cables



Connecting An Antenna :1.) Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and all connected equipment is turned off.

- 2.) Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the antenna/ cable jack on your TV and to the antenna or cable connection.
- 3.) Plug your TV's power cord into a power outlet, then turn on your TV.
- 4.) On the HOME screen, navigate to the INPUTS row, then select Antenna.

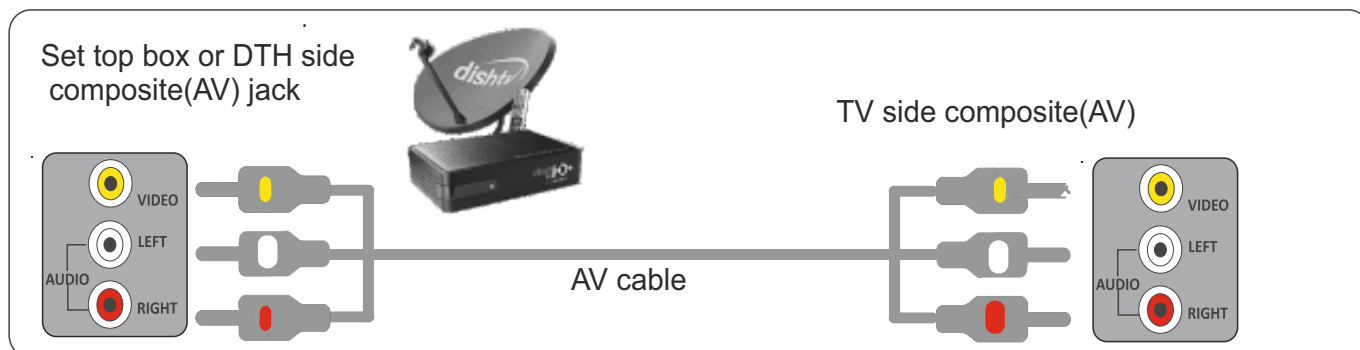
Note: • use a coaxial cable to eliminate interference and noise from radio waves.

- If the antenna is not installed correctly, contact qualified service personnel to correct the problem.
- If the signal level for a channel is weak, the picture may be distorted. Adjust the antenna or use a highly directional outdoor or set top Antenna with a built in amplifier.
- If the picture quality is good on some channels and poor on others, the problem may be caused by a poor or weak signal from the Broadcaster or cable TV provider.
- If you connect to cable TV without a set top box and experience poor picture quality, you may need to install a set top box to improve Signal reception and picture quality. Contact your cable TV provider about upgrading to a set top box.

AV/COMPOSITE :

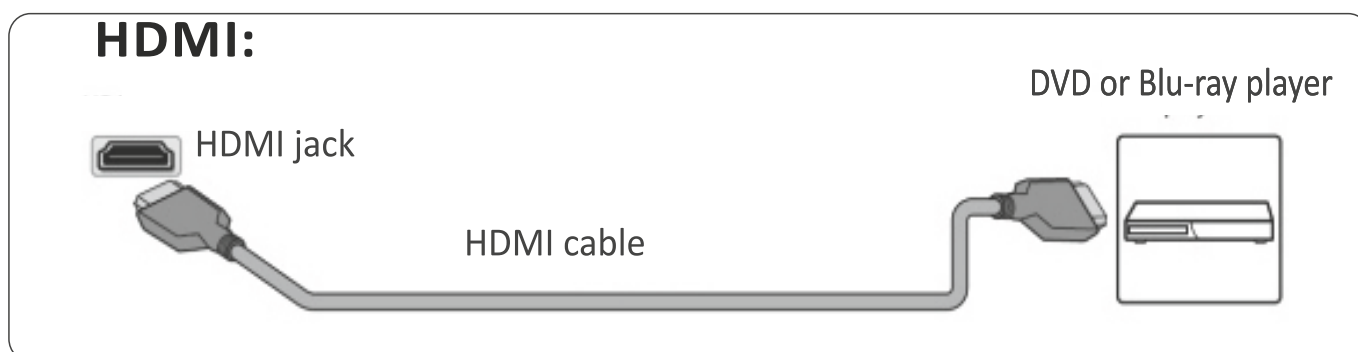

3.)plug your TV's power cord into a power Outlet, then turn on your TV and DVD or Blue-ray player.

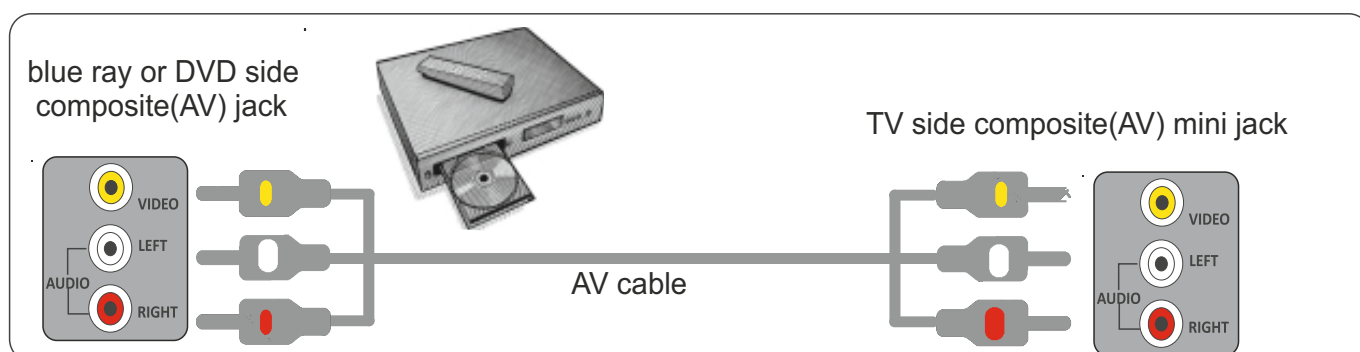

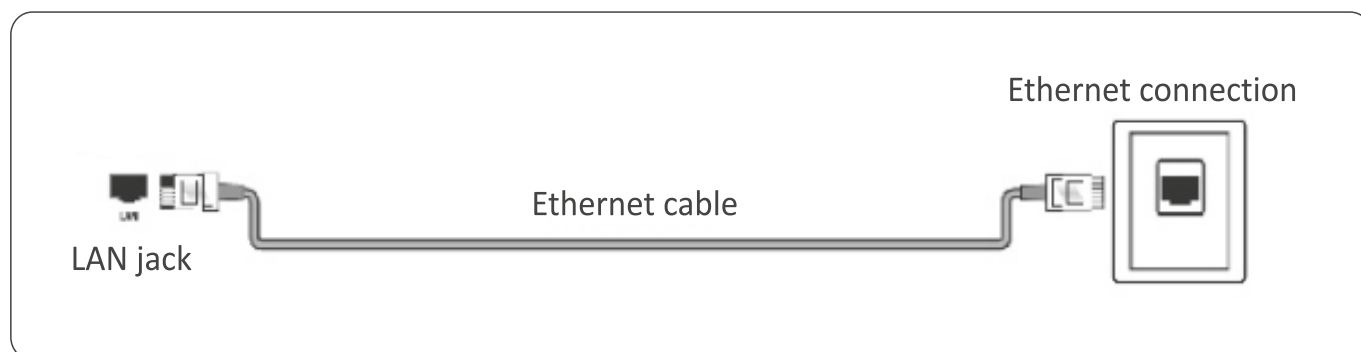

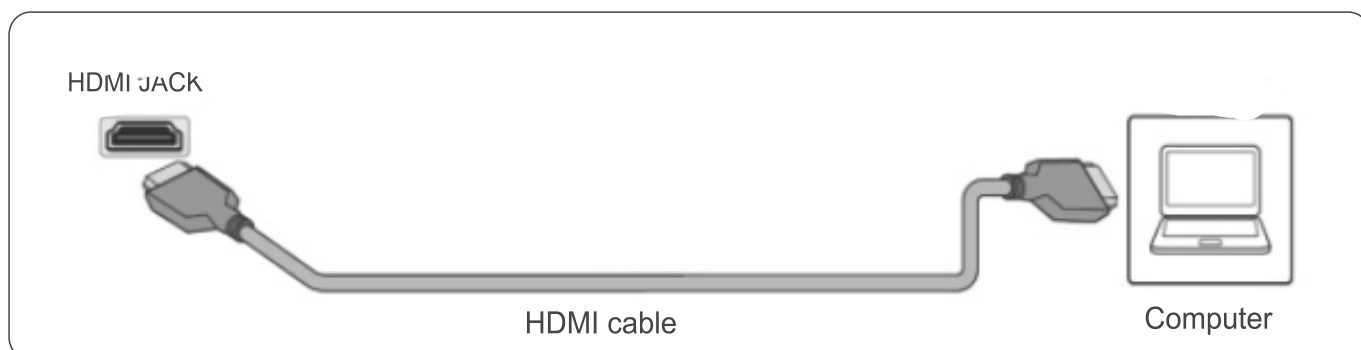
Connecting to Ethernet / RJ45 :



To access the Internet, you can connect to a LAN (Ethernet) network. If you do not want to connect to Wi-Fi.

- Connect an Ethernet cable (not provided) to the LAN jack on your TV and to your Ethernet

Connecting a Computer :



1.) Make Sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the computer is turned Off.

2.) Connect an HDMI cable (not provided) to one of the HDMI jacks on your TV and to the HDMI out jack on the computer.

3.) plug your TV's power cord into a power outlet, then turn on your TV and the computer.

4.) On the HOME screen, navigate to the INPUTS row, then select HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3 (OPTIONAL)

Connecting External Speaker or a Sound bar :

You can connect external speakers or a sound bar using: * Digital audio * Analog audio

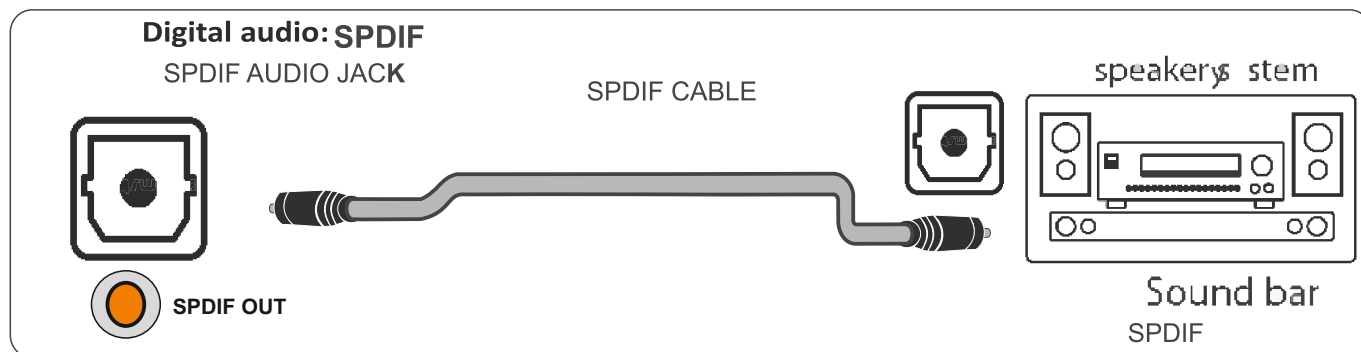
1.) Make sure that your TV power cord is unplugged & the digital speaker system or sound bar is turned off.

2.) Connect a SPDIF audio cable (not provided) to the SPDIF output jack on your TV and to the audio in jack on the digital speaker system or sound bar.

3.) Plug your TV's power cord into a power outlet, then turn on your TV.

4.) Turn on the digital speaker system or sound bar, then set it to the correct source. See the documentation that came along with the digital speaker system or sound bar

Note: Depending on the audio device you are connecting, you may need to change the digital audio format for your TV. The default setting is Auto

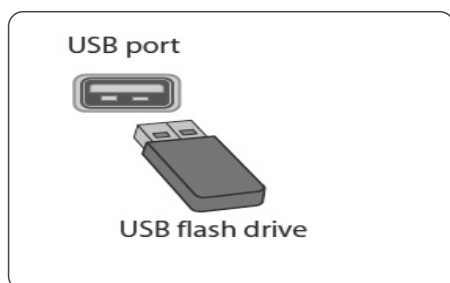


5.) If you need to change the digital audio format, go to the Home menu, select Settings, then select Display & Sounds, then Select Audio Output, then select Digital Audio Format and change the setting to PCM or Dolby Digital.

6.) If you want to turn off your TV speakers, go to the Home menu, select Settings, then select Display & Sounds. Select Audio Output, then select TV Speakers and change the setting to OFF.

Connecting a USB flash drive

Plug a USB flash drive into the USB port on your TV. It takes few seconds for detecting flash drive. "Content loading" message will be seen on TV screen, after detecting flash drive, on TV you will see four options.



1) Your Files: for all content are visible,

2) Video: only compatible Video content play

3) Image: only compatible image file format play

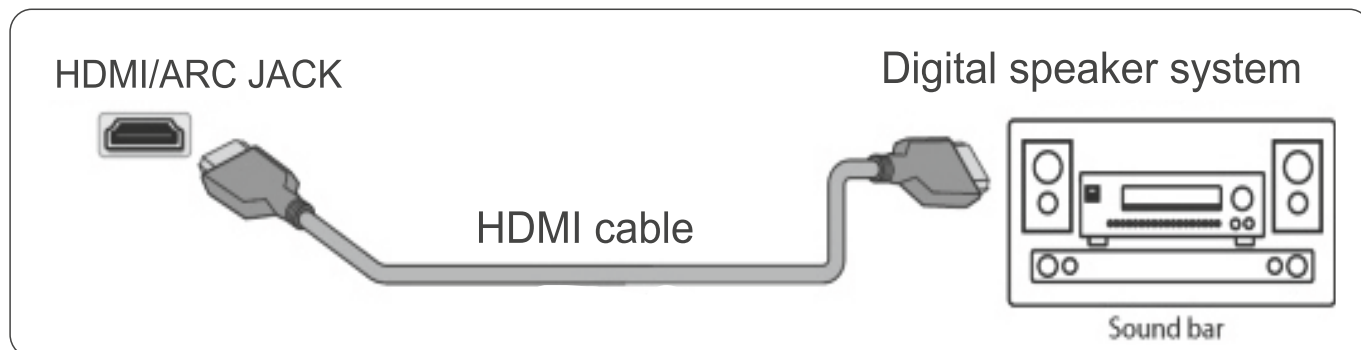
4) Audio: only compatible Audio format play

To safely remove USB storage, you need to "eject" it from your Amazon Fire TV first:

Digital audio using the HDMI/ARC: (Optional)

Your TV can send sound to an ARC device, like an AV receiver, to create a home theater that uses two or more speakers. When you connect external speakers or a sound bar, sound plays through your TV speakers and the external speakers or sound bar.

1.) Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the digital speaker system or sound bar is turned off.



2.) Connect an HDMI cable (not provided) to the HDMI 2/Arc jack on your TV and to the audio in jack on the digital speaker system or sound bar.

3.) Plug your TV's power cord into a power outlet, then turn on your TV.

4.) Turn on the digital speaker system or sound bar, then set it to the correct source. See the documentation that came along with the digital speaker system or sound bar.

Note: Depending on the audio device you are connection, you may need to change the digital audio format for your TV. The default setting is Auto.

5.) If you need to change the digital audio format, go to the Home menu, select Settings, then select Display & Sounds, then Select Audio Output, then select Digital Audio Format and change the setting to PCM or Dolby Digital.

6. If you want to turn off your TV speakers, go the Home menu, select Seettings, then select Display & Sounds. Select Audio Output, then select TV Speakers and change the setting to OFF.

CAUTION:

- Your TV should only be operated from the power source indicated on the label.
- Always unplug the power cord from the power outlet when you will not be using your TV for an extended period of time.

Switching On

Follow the instructions on this page on how to switch on your TV set and the remote control before going on to following pages describing how to use the channel set-up procedure.

1. Insert two batteries in the remote control.

Precautions on using batteries

- Only use the battery types specified.
- Make sure you use the correct polarity.
- Do not mix new and used batteries.
- Do not use rechargeable batteries.
- Do not expose batteries to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like, throw them in a fire, recharge them or try to open them, as this could cause them to leak or explode.
- Remove the batteries from the remote control if you are not using it for a long period of time.

2. Connect the power cable **FIRST** to the television, **THEN** to a mains socket.

(Note: If the power cable is connected to the television, please only connect the power cable to the mains socket.)

If your TV is connected to an AC supply

Your TV set should only be connected to an AC supply. It must not be connected to a DC supply. If the plug is detached from the cable, do not, under any circumstances, connect it to a mains socket, as there is a risk of electric shock.

If your TV is connected to a DC supply

Your TV set should only be connected to a DC supply. It must not be connected to a AC supply. If the plug is detached from the cable, do not, under any circumstances, connect it to a mains socket, as there is a risk of electric shock.

3. Connect an outside aerial to the ANTENNA IN socket at the back of the TV set.

4. When powered on, the TV will be turned on directly or be in standby.

Note: For some models, switch the TV on by pressing the power button.

If the power indicator lights up, the TV set is in standby mode. Press the  button on the remote control or on the TV set to turn on the TV.

Switching off

- To put the TV set into standby mode, press the (button on the remote control or on the TV, the TV set remains powered up, but with low energy consumption.

To switch off the TV set, unplug the mains socket from the mains outlet.

Note: For some models, press the power button to switch off the TV set.

Your TV will require an internet connection to operate all functions. data usage charges may apply.

Please refer to your Internet Service Provider (ISP) for additional information

To access the internet, you must subscribe high speed broadband internet service from your internet service provider.

Your TV can be connected to your home network in two ways:

- Wired, using the RJ45 (LAN) connector on the back panel.
- Wireless, using the internal wireless or external wireless USB adapter and your home wireless network.

Note: The following instructions are just the usual ways to connect your TV to the wired or wireless network

The connection method may be different depending on your actual network configuration. if you have any questions about your home network, please refer to your ISP(Internet Service Provider).

Connecting to a wired network

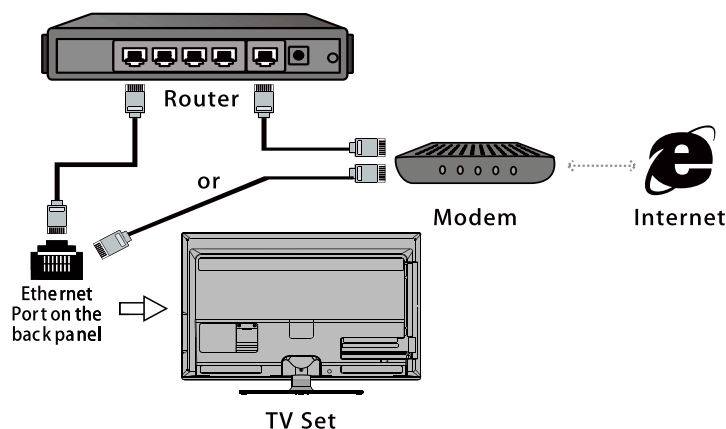
To connect to a wired network:

1. Ensure you have.

- An Ethernet cable long enough to reach your TV
- A router or modem with an available Ethernet port
- A high-speed internet connection
- An **Ethernet (LAN)** port on the back of the TV

2. Connect your Ethernet cable to the router and to the **Ethernet port** on the back of the TV.

3. Use the **Network Settings** to configure the TV



Built-in wireless connection

Connecting to a wireless network

To connect to a wireless network

1. Ensure you have:

- A router broadcasting a high-speed wireless signal
- A high-speed internet connection

2. Use the Network Settings to configure the TV

Note: Some models may have no internal wireless module, you can use wireless network by inserting external wireless adapter into USB socket of the TV. Some external wireless adapters can't be compatible with the TV.

Initial setup

The first time you switch the set on, the Initial setup screen appears, which guides you through the initial setup process.

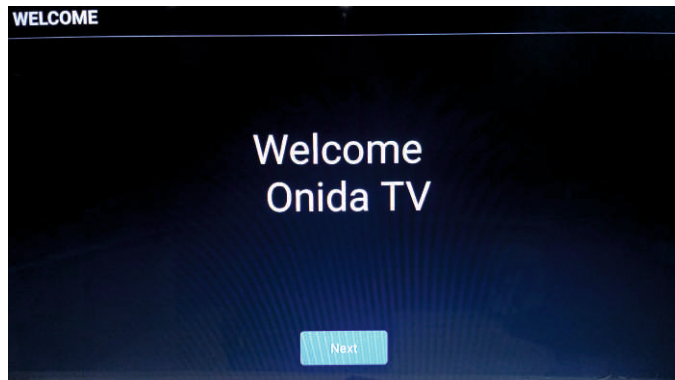

2. Hot plug: Do not disconnection when the system is reading or transmitting data, avoid damaging the system or the device.

3. Pay attention to the power supply of the device when you are using a mobile hard disk or a digital camera.

If the power supply is not sufficient or not stable, you may encounter problems during operating or can not operate at all. In this case, please restart the device, or unplug the device and plug it again, and ensure that its power supply is normal.

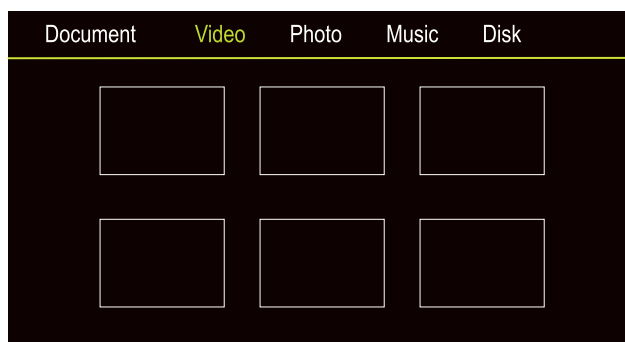
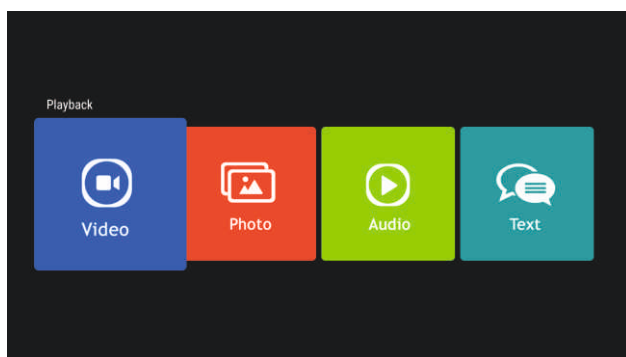

Problems & Solutions

Note: Problems & solutions 1 to 2 are for the TV models which have network functions, so users of non-connected TV models can disregard them.

1. Fail to link to the network.

- Check if your TV is connected with the network;
- Reboot your TV;
- Consult your internet service provider, to confirm if access of your router is supported. Refer to the operation manual of your router.

Make sure if your TV is connected with the router. If the router is well connected and powered on, try to change a new router and network line, and use your PC to have a test. Should your problem persists, try to consult Client Service Centre.

2. The video could not be played smoothly.

- Videos from your USB flash drive It may result from data transmission, or its code flow is far beyond the supported formats of this TV set.
- Videos downloaded from internet, or online videos.
 - a. It may be caused by the lower bandwidth of your network. A high network speed is required to handle online videos.
 - b. Peak internet usage times may affect the bandwidth.
 - c. Check if any other computers on the same network are also operating, as they may be using up bandwidth. Especially if they are downloading or displaying on-line videos.
 - d. The video may not be smooth itself, it is not the problem of your TV or network.

3. When two mobile hard disks are connected with the TV at the same time, they will not be recognized some time.

- All mobile hard disks consume a lot of power, which may result in power supply problems. We recommend inserting only one hard disk, or a low power consumption mobile hard disk

4. The video from a mobile hard disk (USB) is playing with no sound.

- The audio format of the video in your mobile hard disk is not supported by the TV player

5. Some videos fail to play.

- The formats of the videos may not be supported by the TV, especially videos shot by certain kinds of cameras, generally with their private protocol of formats, which are not compatible with our TV.

6. Video stops playing midway.

- Mistakes may occur when videos are copied or compressed, so they may automatically stop playing during playback.

7. What should I pay attention to, when I do SW updating

- No power cuts when SW updating;
- Avoid any operations with your remote control when SW updating; Be patient because the SW updating process may take a little bit longer time.

8. There are no distinct changes of TV interface after SW updating.

- Under certain conditions, SW updating may not only update or add new functions but also improve the performance of the TV set, without distinct changes of interface. Also, there may be no changes to the user interface at all.

Troubleshooting

Most problems you encounter with your TV can be corrected by consulting the following troubleshooting list.

No picture, no sound

1. Check if the fuse or circuit breaker is working.
2. Plug another electrical device into the outlet to make sure it is working or turned on.
3. Power plug is in a bad contact with the outlet.
4. Check the signal source.

No color

1. Change the color system.
2. Adjust the saturation.
3. Try another channel. Black-white program may be

No picture, normal sound

- 1 Adjust the brightness and contrast
2. Broadcasting ailure may happen.

Remote control does not work

- 1.Change the batteries.
2. Batteries are not installed correctly

Normal picture, no sound

1. Press buton ► increase volume
2. Volume is set to mute, press the Mute buton to restore sound.
3. Change the sound system.
4. Broadcasting failure may happen.

Unorderly ripples on the picture

It is usually caused by local interference, such as cars, daylight lamps and hair driers. Adjust the antenna to minimize the interference.

Snowy dots and interference

If the antenna is located in the fringe area Of a television signal where the signal is weak, the picture may be marred by dots. When the signal is extremely weak, it may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the reception

1. Adjust the position and orientation of the in door/ out door antenna.
2. Check the connection Of antenna.
3. Fine tune the channel.
4. Try another channel. Broadcasting ailure may happen.

Ignition

Black spots or horizontal streaks appear, or the picture flu erers or drifts. This is usuallaused by interference from cm car ignition system, neon lamps, electric drills, or Other electrical appliance.

Ghost

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path, the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills, or Other objects. Changing the direction or position Of the antenna may improve the reception.

Radio frequency interference

This interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some case, loss of contrast in the picture Find out and remove the radio interference source.

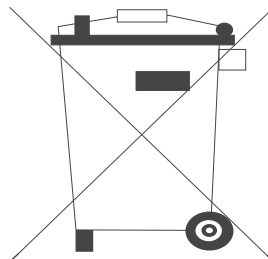
